

General idea of PUSH&PULL

The big problems in urban transport are

- 1. Overwhelming and steadily increasing use of cars in cities with all the negative impacts
- 2. Lack of (financial) resources to encourage use of sustainable modes of transport






General idea of PUSH&PULL: Core funding mechanism

the revenues of parking management (push)


are used to encorage the use of energy-efficient modes of transport (pull)



P PUSH & PULL










Use of revenues from parking management to support sustainable means of transportation





Example I: Use of parking revenues in Ghent, B

The gain of the Mobility Company (parking revenue of both on street parking and the parking garages) is used for

- investment in car parking (incl. P&R lots) and bicycle parking
- for the system of night buses in the city [200.000 Euro]; the remaining amount is covered by the Public Transport Company
- for exploiting a so-called "bicycle point" in the city center (NGO organizes cycle hire/repair, etc.) [60.000 Euro]
- some members of staff fully occupied with Mobility Management, e.g. a Mobility Manager for companies, a parking mediator, etc.

Example II: Use of parking fees in Graz, A

- In 2013 the City of Graz has earned 24,8 million Euro with parking-space management
- 18,6 million Euro were taken from charges, the rest was taken from penalties
- Considering the costs for monitoring, staff and maintenance of the parking machines, **about 3,8 million Euro** remain used for traffic measures such as Park & Ride, mobility checks or more frequent and extended bus traffic






Use of public space for stationary traffic
